

# 1920's



From the November 13, 1924 minutes of the Board of Trustees: "In accordance with the minutes of October 7th, the matter of more room for Sunday School was referred to the Church on October 8th with the result that approximately \$3,000.00 was subscribed for the construction of a California Bungalow on the lot adjoining the church."

In this decade, the Women's Union (several members shown to the left in costume at a special event) met for a full day of sewing, sharing, knitting, quilting, lunching and gabbing. One of their many projects was reported in their minutes of January 7, 1925: "*The report of the committee on the fundraising for the bungalow was read and approved. Motion was made and seconded: That we have a party shower for the bungalow on January 21st. And that a committee for the same be appointed by the chair. Motion carried.*" They also moved and seconded that: '*table cloths and napkins be provided for the bungalow.*' Motion carried.

Rev. Perry F. Schrock was pastor of this Church from 1914- 1939. During that time, he also served as the moderator of the Southern California Congregational Churches from 1928-1929. In his closing report, he stated: "I wish the Conference could make the churches feel that it is as much interested in a high percent of church attendance as it is in a high per capita giving to benevolences.."

"At a special meeting of the Board of Trustees of the First Congregational Church of Santa Ana, held Thursday morning, December 6th, 1929, it was unanimously recommended that an option be given to Mr. T. E. Stephenson, postmaster, for sixty days to purchase the property on the southeast corner of Bush and 7th streets (75 foot on Bush Street by 125 feet on 7th Street) for the total purchase price of \$15,000.00. The same to be used for a site for a federal building (post office),"
