Donated Merck stock was sold and the proceeds (\$8,887.70) were used to cover expenses incurred in the Christian Education building due to a broken water pipe. They also replaced cans with a dumpster; upgraded the phone system; installed rain diverters and new toilet tissue dispensers, trimmed all the trees and hedges on the Church property and removed 11 Fichus trees from the parsonage.

A Brisbane Box tree was planted in honor of Ruth Rowland's 100th birthday. It is located outside the sanctuary. Ruth Rowland's oral history is in print in our church library.



The Deacons served over 600 members and visitors for several years with their monthly Family Sunday Breakfasts. Some of their profits were used to send a family to Pilgrim Pines Family Camp and purchase a Public Address amplifier for Niedringhaus Hall.



With Memorial Fund bequests, we were able to repave the entire parking lot and put a new roof on Niedringhaus Hall. Both the parking lot, in memory of Ed Riniker, and the Fellowship Hall Roof, in memory of Walker T. Stewart, were completely funded by additional donations.
